This week, on Tuesday, the Year 6's, who are preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation, attended Faith Night where we had Father John Madden speak to us, our parents and sponsors about the true meaning of Confirmation.

He spoke to us about how Confirmation isn't just a day to hang out with your family or receive gifts, it's a holy day where we confirm our beliefs in Jesus Christ. It's a day that we, as Year 6's accept God into our lives.

Father John Madden started by talking about how we are gifts to our parents and our parents are gifts to us. This really helped me think about how special our parents are, everything they've done for us, and all the sacrifices they've made.






Later, Father John Madden asked us about the fruits of the Holy Spirit and the gifts of the Holy Spirit. He first asked us about the gifts of the Holy Spirit and how they are gifts from God, and that he wants us to use them. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are knowledge, understanding, right judgment, respect, courage, awe, wonder and finally, wisdom. He explained to us how one gift can be shown in many ways, for example, knowledge can be academic, common sense or by understanding scripture. He told us that by using all these gifts throughout our lives, we would have wisdom. Wisdom can intellectual, emotional and spiritual.



We received worksheets that asked what gifts our parents have and don't have and the answers that were given made for a very interesting conversation. A lot of people said 'patience' and 'self control'. Our parents also received worksheets asking about their child's spirit. We then moved onto Fruits of the Holy Spirit. The fruits of the Holy Spirit are something we grow in every time we do something good, such as giving to the homeless or helping someone who's upset. The fruits are charity, joy, peace, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, patience, gentleness, generosity, trust, prayer and self-control. We were asked about the fruits we have right now and fruits we want to grow in.

I think this faith night was very important for the year 6's to listen to. We learnt so much and it was a very fun experience.



In enhancing our students development in reading skill, ability and competence, we have now added to our literacy resources a further:

2040 decodable books to be used for classroom and take-home purposes (Prep - 2)

120 new decodable big books (Prep - 2)

612 decodable books (which include: 6 x 14 chapter books, 6 x 44 storybooks, and 6 x 44 Fun Facts books (Years 3-6)

This reflects a huge investment into providing you child with reading resources that not only provide the opportunity to develop their ability to read proficiently, comprehend what they are reading, but to have books that they will enjoy reading.



We are doing everything possible to promote and assist your child's literacy at school. The effectiveness of this can be greatly enhanced when your child also gets the opportunity to read each night as part of their school week routine.

There are now mini libraries in each classroom, along with the school's main library. Please take the opportunity to encourage your chid to read and remember to return the books back to school when finished.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 6:51-58

My flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.

Jesus said to the crowd: 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven.

Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another:

'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said.

Jesus replied: 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you.

Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him.

As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me.

This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'

She was a highly regarded speak and wrote many books on spirituality and youth ministry.






