School Fees In Arrears

For families who are currently in **arrears** for the **2024** school year and have not made an arrangement with the school, it is essential that you please attend to your account as soon as possible or to contact the office prior to **Friday, 15th November 2024**.

We truly thank our families who have ensured that their child's school fees and levies have been paid or who have contacted us to put in place arrangements to suit the family budget whilst being able to access the educational services of the school.

Working together makes a huge difference to ensuring we are able to provide you and your child with the best learning, school environment and community experience possible.

Fees & Levies for 2025

Our school has much to offer and provides a very affordable Catholic education for our students.

To keep our own costs as affordable as they are, we do everything possible to maximise our resources and the grants that are made available to us.

However, the payment of the school fees and levies is what makes the biggest difference.

Without families contributing to the running costs of St Catherine of Siena, we simply could not achieve, nor do what we do.

The 2025 School Fees and Levies was presented and approved at our last School Advisory Board meeting held on Tuesday 3rd September.

The **School Family Fee** for 2025 is: **\$1,590**. This fee is billed to each family **regardless of the number of children enrolled** and provides funds for the development of learning resources as well as the maintenance of school facilities and grounds. The **Capital Levy of \$50**, which provides funds for future capital improvement projects, is included within the School Family Fee.

The **Student Levy of \$510** per child (Prep to Year 6), reflects the individual costs associated in engaging each child in their learning experiences and activities. The Student Levy specifically covers costs associated with book lists, curriculum and excursion expenses for each child.

The additional costs relate to the swimming and camping programs, along with technology resources.

The cost of the **Camping Program** is as follows:
Year 3: \$300 Camp Sunnystones, 13th – 14th Nov
Year 4: \$300 Lady Northcote, 7th – 8th August
Year 5: \$375 PBL Kynton, 8th – 10th October
Year 6: \$375 Waratah Bay, 26th – 28th Nov

The school, through various grants, discounts the true cost of the camping program. It has been necessary to do this as camping costs are now inclusive of staffing costs, whereas in the past this was provided on a voluntary basis. Many schools, sadly, have made the decision to discontinue camping programs because of this reason.

The cost of the **Swimming Program** is as follows:

Prep:	\$90 (5 session program)
Year 1:	\$90 (5 session program)
Year 2:	\$90 (5 session program)
Year 3 & 4:	\$ 0 (onsite program)
Year 5	\$40 (2 day program)
Year 6	\$40 (2 day program)

The cost of the **Technology Resourcing Program** is as follows:

Prep:	\$50
Year 1:	\$100
Year 2:	\$100
Year 3:	\$100
Year 4:	\$100
Year 5:	\$0
Year 6:	\$0

The Technology Resourcing Program Levy reflects the purchase of computer devices and associated apps that are used by such devices. After 3 years of use and payment of the Technology Resource Program, students will be provided with a new device. After 3 years of use by the student, the device will be provided to the family for private use.

Prep students are provided with an Apply I-Pad that is used to support learning throughout the year but is retained by the school.

The school is covering the cost of the Year 5 and Year 6 Technology Resourcing Levy next year and then Year 6 in 2026. This recognises the change in the provisioning of devices and that the devices, at the time of these students graduating from St Catherine of Siena will be returned to the school for reuse. All students from Prep to Year 6, from 2027, will then be billed the Technology Resource Levy.

We take pride in the fact that we are able to achieve excellent educational outcomes for our students whilst providing an affordable Catholic education.

2025 Fee & Levy Billing Dates

In keeping our costs low and affordable, it is essential that families contribute to their child's education by ensuring that payment of the fees and levies are made each year.

For 2025, the **Family Fee** is billed in **three (3) instalments** with the **Student Levy** being paid in full by the **10th March 2025**.

Instalment 1: February 14
Family Fee \$530.00 + Student Levy + Technology Resource Program Levy

Instalment 2: May 14
Family Fee \$530.00

Instalment 3: August 14
Family Fee \$530.00

***All other fees, e.g. Camp and Swim Program due prior to time of event**

Please note that all school fees are due at the beginning of each billing period as per the instalment dates or as arranged with the Principal. Any alternative arrangements need to be organised with the Principal during the first term of 2025.

Again, I remind families that are in financial difficulty or require assistance to please contact the school so that we are able to assist you at this time. Fee concessions are available.

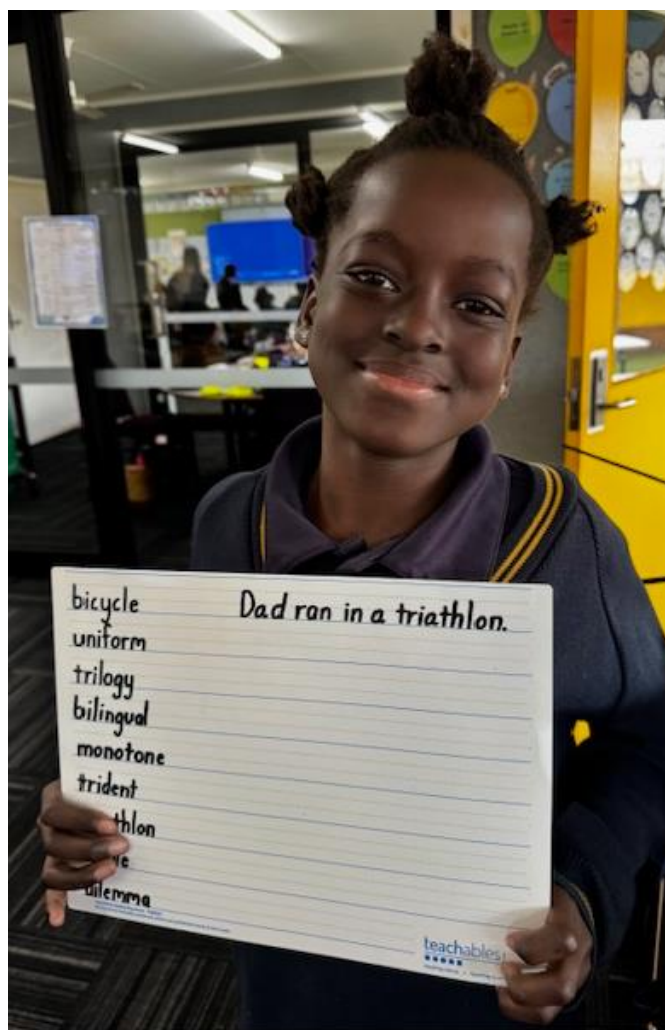

One Last Reminder: 2025 Class Placement Parental Input (Closes Friday 8th November)

Thank you to the many parents who have already responded to our invitation to provide us with additional information to assist with class placement for next year.

As mentioned previously, your child's teachers spend an amazing amount of time with your child during the school year. They are aware of most, but maybe not all, of your child's strengths and challenges from a school perspective. It is their knowledge, observation and insight that provide the basis from which class structures and placement are created.

However, as a parent, your knowledge is far more profound through the simple relationship of child and parent. You hear the story of their daily experiences and know intimately of your child's strengths, challenges and amazing potential. You know of the relationships they have in and outside of school, the learning and teachers that inspire them to do their best and the friendships that either help them to flourish or, at times, struggle.

It is within this context that we invite you to write about your child's learning and social needs to assist us in the placement of your child into specific classrooms for the 2025 school year.

When receiving a letter that requests a specific teacher, knowing that the teacher may not be in the same year level the following year, we read it as a parent's way of expressing the type of teacher your child responds well to. In doing so, it affirms the quality, temperament, characteristics of the teaching staff that we wish to foster at St Catherine of Siena.

At the same time, it gives us an insight into the quality of relationship that has been formed between parent and teacher over the year(s). A positive relationship between parent, student and teacher makes a huge difference in the way a student engages in their learning and the school community.

Please note that we may not be able to provide you with exactly what you want, but we do try to do our best given the many and diverse factors that go into making up a class.

This Weekend's Gospel Resonates With The Servant leadership We Aspire To Develop Amongst Our Staff At St Catherine's

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 10:35-45

The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for all.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him, 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them: 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

Gospel Reflection

James and John are effectively calling 'shotgun' on the best seats at the table! When they ask to sit at the left and right hand of Jesus, they are asking Jesus to name them as his deputies. They're looking to secure for themselves positions of power and authority. The only problem is that they have a completely messed up idea of what it means for Jesus to enter into his glory. For several weeks now, we have been exploring a theme from the Gospel of Mark that follows a physical journey towards Jerusalem as well as a symbolic and theological journey towards what is going to occur in Jerusalem – Jesus' arrest, crucifixion and resurrection. Throughout this journey, Jesus has been trying to prepare the disciples for what is to come and

educate them about what it really means to be a disciple of his. Three times Jesus tells the disciples explicitly what lies ahead. Each time the disciples fail to grasp what Jesus tells them. Despite occasional glimpses of insight, the disciples still believe that Jesus is going to rise up as a political or military figure. In a complete dismissal of this sort of thinking, Jesus declares quite forcefully that leadership of this sort is not what he intends for himself, nor for those who follow him.

Leadership in the Jesus model is about being of service to others; it is not about prestige and acclamation. Many of the best leaders are those who do not have any title of leadership or authority. Their leadership and authority come from what they do and how they do it. They inspire others to follow their example. They don't demand it; they don't bully; they don't play power games. People simply want to follow their example.

Living the Gospel – Servant Leadership

What does it really mean to practise servant leadership? It means placing the needs of others before your own desires for prestige or authority. We've all known people who have been given a position of leadership and they really only wanted the job as recognition of their popularity; a thank you for previous work done; an opportunity to demonstrate their strength of will or cleverness with words. Servant leadership is about collaborating; it's about empowering people to do their best; it's about trusting others and about rolling up your sleeves and getting on with the job.

Have you thought? Integrity

Who do you really admire? Who would you really like to be like? Aside from sports stars, models and actors whose particular skills you might admire or even envy; who is a person who lives their life in a way that you would like to emulate? Perhaps it's not that you want to do exactly what they have done but rather it's the way they've gone about living their life. I would bet that there is a close match between what they hold to be true and the way they live their life – integrity!

Scriptural context – Mark's Gospel

Despite appearing second, Mark's gospel is now recognised as being the first written of those that appear in the Bible. The shortest of the four gospels, it begins with Jesus' entry into public life and, in its original form, ends with the discovery of the empty tomb. It is sometimes called a gospel 'in a hurry' as the movement between events is almost abrupt. The gospel writer identifies almost immediately that Jesus is God's 'beloved Son' and then spends the rest of the gospel describing the gradual revelation of this fact and the disciples' growing awareness.

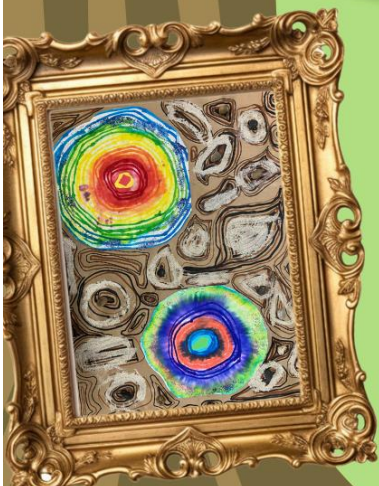
