It is incredible to have received so few emails following our first transition day having had to place 510+ students across 21 classes.

As communicated earlier in the week, there were 5 classes who still did not have a teacher allocated to them. I am very happy to announce that as of today, that number is now reduced to 2, having been able to employ teachers for Years 2, 4 and 6.

Located further in the newsletter is information as to the staff that are leaving and those who are joining us.

Thank you to the parents I had asked to pray for us in resolving the staffing issue, your prayers appear to have been answered.

The following provides strategies that you, as a parent or carer can use to assist your child with developing their social & emotional skills in adapting to change, enhancing their resilience and developing new social networks.

Looking forward to catching up with you all at this coming weeks' Christmas Carols & Picnic.

# A Time Of Change

The transition (Orientation) days are a strategy we use to provide our students with a sense of belonging, an opportunity to get to know both the teacher and the students they will share the coming year with. It is also an opportunity to get a sense of the learning environment they will be working within.

Transition, better described as a process of getting used to change, provides your child with huge opportunities for personal, emotional and social growth. It's something we should not fear but embrace.

The following are a few tips for you as a parent or carer in supporting your child as they move from one classroom to the next:

### Encourage self-advocacy.

Self-advocacy is one of the most important skills your child will learn over the next few years. Speaking up for him or herself and knowing how to ask for what they need is a critical, lifelong skill. Your child can only learn it if you make an intentional effort to back away and let him or her step up to the plate.

- When your child has a question about a project or a homework task, make sure he or she contacts the teacher, not you. Help your child brainstorm what to say, and maybe even draft the email or conversation together, but let the message come from your child.
- When your child feels like another student wronged him or her, teach them to use their teacher as a resource. Help your child report the incident to the teacher or even principal but let him or her take the lead keeping in mind the age of the child themselves.

Side note: With these examples, I encourage parents to follow up with teachers to make sure your child really did follow through and advocate for themselves. I have written emails when my own children were at primary school that simply said "I'm just checking to make sure my daughter talked to you about ..." This is very different from taking the lead and contacting teachers to solve it yourself.

### Allow your child to struggle.

This one is always hard for parents, and for good reasons. We don't like to see our children struggle. Our instinct is to jump in and rescue. However, we all know that the greatest lessons in life come from learning from our mistakes, and if our goal is to raise children to become strong, independent adults, we need to learn to let them stumble.

- Our kids take their lead from our energy as parents. The attitude you project will be the attitude they absorb. Next year will again show you an unbelievable transformation! Allow your child to suffer the "natural consequences" of being unprepared. Maybe he or she will get in trouble. Maybe your child will receive feedback that they don't want to hear. It will sting and your child will be upset, but hopefully habits will start to change. At the same time, celebrate growth, their achievements, their their independence at taking responsibility for being the best that they can be.
- Stop rescuing! Don't bring the missing work to school for your child. Don't write the teacher a note about how busy your family was and why homework didn't get finished. Let your child learn to deal with the consequences.
- Focus on growth instead of grades. Your child won't earn an 'A' on every single task, and that's okay. Focus your conversations on how hard he or she is working, what is being learned, what support is needed, and how skills are growing, rather than just what your child's grades are.

The most important thing parents can do to support their child at this age is learn to ask, "How can I help? What kind of support do you need?" instead of "How can I fix this for you?"

### Encourage positive risk-taking.

Primary school is the perfect time to try new things, and becoming comfortable with taking positive risks is another critical skill in a child's development. Some ideas for next year's risk-taking include:

- Try a new sport.
- Join a club or start a new one.
- Expand their circle of friends.

There are so many ways your child can learn to take a positive risk. The important part as a parent is to always acknowledge and praise the effort and <u>courage</u> it takes to try something new.

Embrace uncertainty. Some of the most beautiful chapters in our lives won't have a title until much later.


## Bulmans Road Upcoming Closure 9th December

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY




The Intercultural Captains, at last week's school assembly, spoke to us about the development of our school's Welcome To Country design & display.

We received 30 submissions. The Intercultural Team nailed it down to 4 finalists. The artists have been kept anonymous, to avoid students just voting for their friends. We want students to look at each design, read the artist's story behind their design and then cast their vote. We are now able to name the students as voting has concluded.

The following highlights the thoughtfulness, thinking and meaning behind each of the illustrations that made it to the the finalist stage. Congratulations to all students that participated and put forward a submission.

The announcement of the winning design was made at today's assembly and will be published in next week's newsletter.



In my picture I decided to use dots because it is one of the traditional ways Aboriginal people paint. I used lots of symbols to represent Aboriginal people and animals drinking water from the river along the bank. I used green dots to represent the grass and brown to represent the river bank. You can see I have included animal tracks near the blue water. The symbol on the top right means community and gathering together. The other symbols represent people, who are in the grass foraging for food.


I wanted this picture to look like traditional Aboriginal artwork. I was inspired by Aboriginal artists and paintings to create my art. Thank you for your time, please vote for my drawing.



In this drawing I chose to use red, black and yellow. These are the colours on the Aboriginal flag. I drew moving kangaroo footprints because kangaroos are an Australian native animal.

On the bottom right, I drew the symbol for people meeting in a group. This represents the community. I then started to get creative so I decided to draw a connected water hole in the colours black, red and yellow.

The handprint with the Aboriginal flag is a connection to the indigenous Australians, who are the custodians of our land. Underneath the hand, I drew a snake to represent the Dreamtime story about creation.



In this picture, I chose to draw honey ants because honey ants are a source of food for the Aboriginals. Next to the honey ants, I drew the meeting place because that's where the Aboriginal people discussed things.

I drew the honey ants' nest because they need a place to hide and survive. Next to the honey ants, I drew a lake because Aboriginal people used to hunt and fish on the water. At the top of my picture, I drew the Aboriginal flag, Torres Strait Islander flag and the Australian flag. This is to represent unity and coming together.



In this drawing I used brown, pink, orange, yellow and red colours. This is because these colours represent the Earth.

The Aboriginal people create artwork using these earth tone colours. Brown for the soil and red, orange, pink and yellow for the sun. The Aboriginal people are the traditional custodians of our land.

The circle symbols represent people meeting. I have also drawn animal footprint symbols. I have included lizards in my design because they are part of the Dreaming stories that relate to the creation of the natural world.

Finally, the Boomerangs represent linking everything together as they come back to you.
