# Family Carols Evening




Dear Parents, Carers, Students and Friends

# CRAFTING A MEANINGFUL ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY



Congratulations to Priscilla L (5A), whose Acknowledgement of Country Design was selected as the winning design for our school in creating a large display for our school hall. Priscilla will work with a graphic designer to refine her art work prior to formal publication and printing of it. We have taken the opportunity to republish the meaning behind the artwork presented.



In this drawing I chose to use red, black and yellow. These are the colours on the Aboriginal flag. I drew moving kangaroo footprints because kangaroos are an Australian native animal.

On the bottom right, I drew the symbol for people meeting in a group. This represents the community. I then started to get creative so I decided to draw a connected water hole in the colours black, red and yellow.

The handprint with the Aboriginal flag is a connection to the indigenous Australians, who are the custodians of our land. Underneath the hand, I drew a snake to represent the Dreamtime story about creation.





# **Enrolment Availability**

It is great to see new enrolments occurring each day as we move closer to the **2025 school year**.

Following discussion with the staff and agreeing on class numbers as prescribed by the Enterprise Bargaining Agreement, class sizes are capped at the following numbers:

Prep to Year 2 – maximum 26 students per class Year 3 to Year 6 – maximum 28 students per class

Based upon these numbers, we would like to take this opportunity to advise parents that there is limited spaces in many of our year levels next year.

The following outlines the current spaces available for the 2025 school year. Please note that once we have reached the cap for that year level, all further applications are placed on a wait list. This was the case for the Year 5's this year.

**Prep** – 2 further enrolments available

Year 1 - 12 further enrolments available

Year 2 - 11 further enrolments available

Year 3 - 9 further enrolments available

Year 4 - 10 further enrolments available

Year 5 - 4 further enrolments available

Year 6 - 3 further enrolments available

As the school's academic performance continues to grow and our current families continue to speak highly of the school, we envisage that there will be strong growth in the coming years. Since the 2023 August census of 487 students, we are expecting our 2025 February census to be 515 students. The school has a maximum capacity of 570 students across 21 classrooms.

If you know of families with children who may be commencing school in **2026**, we would strongly encourage you to ask them to contact the school to register their child's name. There is no cost associated with this, however it is an opportunity to ensure a placement, in alignment with our enrolment policy, when the time comes.









# 2025 Prep Transition

Today, our new Prep students for 2025, together with their parents and carers, gathered for one last time. We began this session with a very simple prayer that we would like to share with all parents. It's a prayer of blessing for our children, a reminder of our own relationship with God and the responsibility we have in doing our utmost as parents and teachers in raising our children "to be who God meant them to be".

# What, then, must we do?


When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.



# There Is Something of Danny in All of Us.

A Reflection On This Weekend's Gospel



During Advent, Daniel went to his mother demanding a new bicycle for Christmas.

'Danny, we can't afford it', she said, 'so write a letter to Jesus and pray for one instead.'

'Dear Jesus, I've been a good boy this year and would appreciate a new bicycle. Your friend, Daniel.'

Now Danny guessed that Jesus really knew he was a brat so he tore it up and tried again.

'Dear Jesus, I've been an OK boy this year and I want a new bicycle. Yours truly, Daniel.'

Danny knew this wasn't true so he tore it up and tried again.

'Dear Jesus, I've thought about being a good boy so may I have a new bicycle? Daniel.'

Finally, Danny thought better of making these false claims and so ran to the Church.

He went inside and stole a small statue of Mary and ran out the door. He went home, hid it under his bed and wrote this letter.

'Jesus, let's face it, I've broken most of the Commandments; tore up my sister's doll and lots more. I'm desperate. I've got your mother Mary, if you ever want to see her again, give me a bike for Christmas. You know who.'

There is something of Danny in all of us.

We often think that we can bargain with God to get the best possible deal out of life. The problem with this bargaining image is that it is based on faith that does not believe in Advent. The bargaining image of God is the furthest thing from the mind of the writers of today's readings – Zephaniah, the Canticle from Isaiah, Philippians and Luke. Each of them rejoices in the undeserved gift God gives to the world. We do not deserve God's love given to us in the Babe of Bethlehem. It is God's overflowing goodness which pours out in Jesus and through him and the Spirit we have been welcomed into the family of God and bear his name.

These Scriptures remind us that God has not held back one thing in his love for us. By becoming one with us in our flesh, God has done everything he can to assure us of his saving love. He has shown us all what can be shown about how to live lives of sacrifice, justice and love to transform our world.

In this Sunday's Gospel people are full of wanting to know what they can do to earn God's love. The crowds, tax collectors and soldiers ask what they can do to gain God's favour. While there is much to do, Advent reminds us every year that all we do is a response to the initial, undeserved goodness of God.

Still the image of us 'doing a deal' with God is so prevalent in our theology and prayer. 'I will be a better person if I get well.' 'I will return to Sunday Mass if I pass my exams.'

All dreadful stuff. And the Church has to take some responsibility for this and correct it.

Advent teaches us that we have to witness to a God who risked everything so that we might know love and life in this world and in the next. We hold and proclaim, in season and out of season, a God who emptied himself of power and might and came to us as a baby.

That's not the profile of a deal-doer. It's the portrait of a lover.
