
It is in the best interest of the children in the classroom that younger siblings are not to be present in the classroom with their parent at this time.


There will, at this stage, be two sessions offered:

The attendance rate is the percentage of fulltime student days attended by our students out of the total of fulltime students days at the school. This provides a high level-measure of overall attendance at the school. Our results for last year show that we maintained a slightly better result than the average of school in the Archdiocese of Melbourne. However, the next graph shows something even better. The attendance level is the percentage of our students whose attendance rate is at least 90%. This provides a measure of both persistent absenteeism or attendance at the school. It is fantastic to see our students attending consistently than what is currently occurring in the Archdiocese of Melbourne.



## School Communication

In responding to the school review last year, we are reviewing how the school communicates with parents and the ease in which information is accessible, both in content and language.

For the purposes of communication protocols until a full review is undertaken, we have five (5) primary communication platforms. They are:

- Direct email
- Operoo
- SeeSaw
- School Newsletter
- Text Messaging

For our current and new families, it's a great opportunity to remind ourselves which platform is used for what purpose.

#### **Direct email**

Emails are sent to communicate important information regarding school organisation and procedural matters. (An example is the content of this email.) Information sent via email is considered to be very important for the parent / carer to know. It is primarily used by the school administration.

#### Operoo

Operoo is specifically designed to minimise the paperwork required by parents when completing forms or requests for information during the year. Examples of this are permission forms for camps, excursions or the opportunity for us to seek feedback or your views around specific school actions or policies.

#### SeeSaw

This platform is to be used by teachers and parents to communicate student learning, achievements and provide feedback. It is primarily used by the classroom teacher. Some whole school messages that are emailed out will be replicated on SeeSaw also.

#### **School Newsletter**

The school newsletter provides a general update and account of school activities while informing parents of upcoming events. The school newsletter is where most information is posted and is the primary source of updated information for parents.

#### **Text Messaging**

Text messages are only sent in the event that there is important and urgent information that parents are required to know. This could be when we need you to be aware of an email that has been sent or in the event of a critical incident. When receiving a text message, we ask that you read the message and act upon the information as a matter of priority.



Dear Parents and Carers,

We are excited to announce that all students at our school will commence learning Auslan (Australian Sign Language) as part of the L.O.T.E (Languages) area of the Victorian Curriculum. This learning opportunity will introduce students to Auslan and Deaf Culture, fostering inclusivity, communication skills, and an appreciation for diverse communities.

To support learning, there will be a weekly newsletter item and a Seesaw post outlining the learning focus and providing an at-home activity. These resources are designed to engage all students and provide an opportunity for families to share in this learning journey.

Throughout Term 1, students will explore topics such as an introduction to Auslan, learning the alphabet, colours, everyday signs, family, school-related vocabulary, farm animals, describing animals, and numbers. Activities will include interactive games, songs, and practical applications to ensure learning is engaging and meaningful. For example, students will practise signing their names, identifying colours in the classroom, and using signs to describe animals.

We look forward to sharing this exciting journey in Auslan learning with you and your children. Thank you for your ongoing support in making learning engaging and accessible for all.
